
There Once Was A Kangaroo


Once upon a time, there was a land far, far away, a paradise of lush forests, crystal streams, beautiful beaches and unique animals.




People lived in harmony with the land and each other.




They told stories about the animals who also lived in harmony with the land and each other.




Life was perfect in paradise until...


Ships came, bringing strangers to paradise.



The lush forests, crystal streams and beautiful beaches were new to the strangers. When they saw the unique animals, they said, "My, what large ears you have."




And, "What a long nose you have."




And, "What a big pouch you have."

The strangers wanted to farm the land and graze sheep. There were no sheep living in paradise. The strangers bought sheep with them from home.




Paradise was full of trees.

Farmers loved to count their money in their parlours.




One day, a farmer growled, "Who's been in my field nibbling my wheat?"


The farm.




"Fee! Fie! Foe! Foo! I smell the blood of a kangaroo," roared the farmers.

Father kangaroos loved their families, teaching their sons how to grow big and strong.




Until...


"A-hunting we will go. A-hunting we will go. Heigh-ho, the derry-o, a-hunting we will go," sang the farmers.



Kangaroos tried to flee in fright but not all of them reached safety.




Over time, kangaroos disappeared from the land.
